| <b>Procedure Code</b>   | <b>Description</b>  |

| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) ASSERTIVE COMMUNITY TREATMENT (ACT)</b> | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Assertive Community Treatment (ACT)” means a self-contained program which is the fixed point of responsibility for providing treatment, rehabilitation, and support services to persons with alcohol and/or other drug problems who have, e.g., a history of multiple hospitalizations, involvement with the judicial system, homeless shelters, or alcohol and/or other drug residential programs. Using an integrated services approach, the ACT team merges clinical and rehabilitation staff expertise, e.g., substance abuse, psychiatric, employment, within a mobile service delivery system. The ACT team provides the core treatment, rehabilitation/habilitation and service activities required by targeted consumers. The ACT team members have ongoing communications to assess each consumer's current status and service needs. The level of services provided should meet the fluctuating needs of the consumer. Consumers receive ongoing assessment including work and academic areas. Vocational services, including supported employment, are an integral part of the team's approach.</b> |

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| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) BRIEF INTERVENTION</b> | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Brief Intervention” means a service provided by an appropriately trained clinician in a non-alcohol and/or other drug treatment program setting to an individual identified as having a problem or risk of developing a problem related to alcohol and/or other drug use. This service identifies the nature and extent of the problem or risk, makes recommendations to the individual regarding addressing the problem or risk, and makes referrals to appropriate services, including alcohol and/or other drug treatment when indicated.</b> |
| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) CHILD CARE</b>         | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Child Care” means care of the children of clients undergoing treatment for alcoholism or drug abuse while the client is in treatment.</b>  |

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| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) CHILD DEVELOPMENT</b> | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Child Development” means services designed to foster the development of the children of clients undergoing treatment for alcohol and/or other drug abuse while the client is in treatment, including, but not limited to the children’s psychological, emotional, social, and intellectual development.</b>                                   |
| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) COMMUNITY SUPPORT</b> | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Community Support” means an outpatient service provided to clients in transition to less intensive levels of treatment for alcohol and/or other drug abuse. It consists primarily of professional oversight, supervision, and intervention to help clients maintain activities in education, employment, or other therapeutic activities.</b> |
| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) CONSULTATION</b>      | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Consultation” means consultation between alcohol and/or other drug abuse professionals.</b>   |

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| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) CONTINUING CARE</b>          | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Continuing Care” means structured alcohol and/or other drug treatment services provided to a client after discharge from an alcohol and/or other drug treatment facility that are designed to strengthen and support the client’s recovery and prevent relapse.</b> |
| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) DAY TREATMENT</b>            | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Day Treatment” means treatment activities offered in half-day or full day increments, regularly scheduled for multiple sessions throughout the week. Clients attend in groups. This is a less intensive activity than that defined by HCPCS code H0015.</b>         |
| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) FAMILY/COUPLE COUNSELING</b> | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Family/Couple Counseling” means counseling for alcohol and/or drug treatment with a client’s family members or significant others, typically delivered as a scheduled hourly event. In some instances, the client may not be present during these sessions.</b>     |

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| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) HALFWAY HOUSE</b>                    | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Halfway House” means residential setting for client under treatment for alcohol and/or other drug abuse in transition from more to less intensive levels of care. Services are primarily room and board with professional supervision or oversight. This service does not apply to hospital inpatient programs.</b>                                |
| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) LEVEL OF CARE DETERMINATION</b>      | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Level of Care Determination” means the use of standard client placement criteria by an appropriately trained clinician to determine the most appropriate placement of a client. This service is typically provided prior to admission for treatment of a substance use condition and precedes comprehensive assessment and treatment planning.</b> |
| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) MEALS FOR TREATMENT PARTICIPANTS</b> | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Meals for Treatment Participants” means meals for clients participating in alcohol and/or other drug treatment in a non-residential setting.</b>   |

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| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) OTHER SERVICES</b>                    | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Other Services” means services needed for the treatment of alcohol and/or other drug abuse, which are not coded elsewhere.</b>  |
| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) OUTPATIENT REHABILITATION SERVICE</b> | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Outpatient Rehabilitation Service” means an outpatient alcohol/or other drug treatment service that operates for at least four or more hours per day for five or more days per week, in which the client participates in accordance with an approved individualized treatment plan. Outpatient Rehabilitation Services may include, but are not limited to: assessment, individual and group counseling, occupational therapy, activity therapies, expressive therapies (art, drama, poetry, music, movements), referral and information, drug screening urinalysis, medication administration, medical services, case management services, and nutrition counseling.</b> |

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| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) ROOM AND BOARD</b>                             | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Room and Board” means room and board for clients under treatment for alcohol and/or drug abuse. It does not include clinical or therapeutic services. This service does not apply to hospital inpatient programs.</b>   |
| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) SIGN LANGUAGE OR ORAL INTERPRETER SERVICES</b> | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Sign Language or Oral Interpreter Services” means an additional service to assure the treatment for alcohol and/or other drug abuse is understood or received for clients who require sign language or oral interpretation, including but limited to those services required by the Americans with Disabilities Act.</b>                |
| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) SKILLS DEVELOPMENT</b>                         | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Skills Development” means activities to develop a range of skills to help maximize client community integration and independent living. Services may be provided in individual or group settings. They need not be scheduled events, but may be applied in the context of other normal activities, such as education or employment.</b> |

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| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) SPECIMEN COLLECTION</b>                                     | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Specimen Collection” means the collection and handling of hair, saliva, or urine for the purposes of analysis for the presence of alcohol and/or other drugs, and does not include the laboratory analysis of such specimens.</b>   |
| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) SUPPORTIVE LIVING SERVICE</b>                               | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Supportive Living Service” means 24-hour per day, seven days per week independent living with limited professional supervision provided for persons in recovery for alcohol and other drug problems who have completed treatment services at a higher level of care and have been referred to the Supportive Living Service program by that service.</b>  |
| <b>ALCOHOL AND/OR OTHER DRUG (ALSO KNOWN AS CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE) TREATMENT(SERVICE) PLAN DEVELOPMENT AND/OR MODIFICATION</b> | <b>“Alcohol and/or Other Drug (also known as Chemical Dependency or Substance Abuse) Treatment (service) Plan Development and/or Modification” means design or modification of the treatment or service plan for alcohol and/or other drug abuse. This may be the initial plan for a client beginning treatment or the modification of a plan for a client already engaged. It is typically a scheduled event not necessarily delivered in conjunction with other treatment. This event may require the participation of clinicians and specialists other than those normally providing treatment.</b> |
